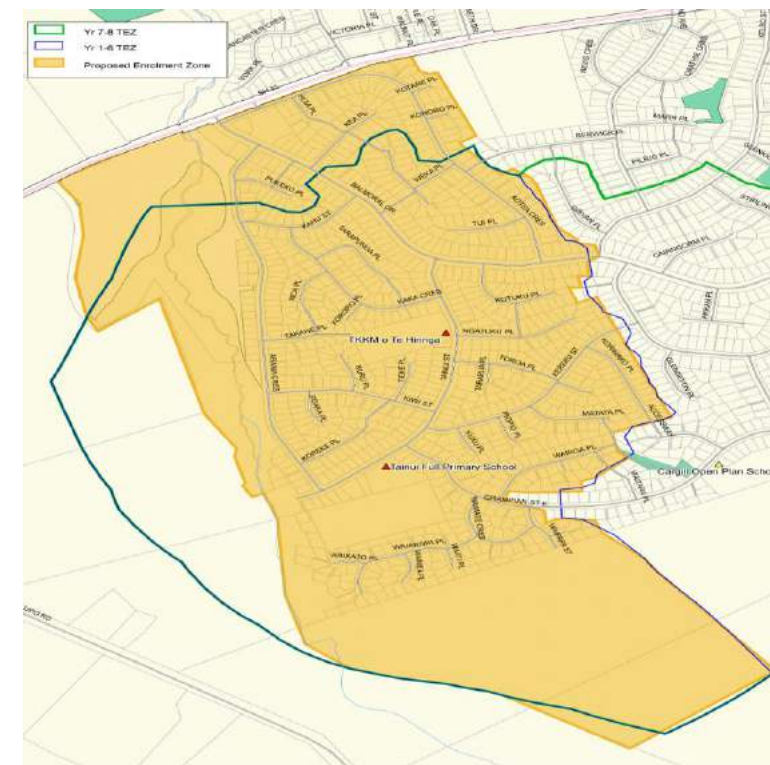
Automatic Payments

As the school uniform is now being sold down at the Tokoroa Warehouse and school levies are no longer, we are asking that automatic payments be stopped. ...Enrolment Scheme...

The Tainui Full Primary School Board of Trustees is advising that the Board has been working with the Ministry of Education and has agreed to develop a draft enrolment scheme 'school zone.' The Ministry agrees that there is likely to continue to be overcrowding at Tainui and continued pressure on facilities should the roll continue to grow. We are very close to our capacity. Part of this process is that we are required to consult with our students, parents, local community, parents of prospective students of Tainui and with the Boards of other local schools and ECEs that may be affected by the school zone.

What is an enrolment scheme? An Enrolment Scheme is a means of preventing overcrowding at a school, ensuring fair and transparent processes are used to determine enrolment eligibility, and enables the Ministry of Education to make best use of the current schools in the surrounding area. Each enrolment scheme must contain a home zone with clearly defined boundaries. A school enrolment scheme gives students who live in the home zone a guarantee that they can go to that school. The Enrolment Scheme also details the way in which students may enrol at a Special Programme run by the school, and the way in which out-of-zone applications will be balloted.

Our School App has a new COVID-19 Check-in module

Available on App version 2.4.0 or greater



Parents, caregivers and visitors can use the App to:

- 1) Check in to the School on arrival by registering your details.
- 2) Show staff confirmation screen if requested.
- 3) Check out when leaving the premises.

To download the App simply scan the QR code or go to the App Store on your Apple or Android device and Search 'SchoolAppsNZ'.

Alert Level 2 — Reduce

The disease is contained, but the risk of community transmission remains.

Risk assessment

- Limited community transmission could be occurring.
- Active clusters in more than one region.
- Range of measures that can be applied locally or nationally
- People can connect with friends and family, and socialize in groups of up to 100, go shopping, or travel domestically, if following public health guidance.
- Keep physical distancing of two meters from people you don't know when out in public or in retail stores. Keep one-meter physical distancing in controlled environments like workplaces, where practicable.
- People 7 years old and older may consider wearing a face covering when physical distancing cannot be maintained.
- No more than 100 people at gatherings, including weddings, birthdays and funerals and tangihanga.
- Businesses can open to the public if following public health guidance including physical distancing and record keeping. Alternative ways of working encouraged where possible.
- Hospitality businesses must keep groups of customers separated, seated, and served by a single person. Maximum of 100 people at a time.
- All businesses must display a government issued QR code for use with the NZ COVID Tracer App by 19 August.
- Face coverings are encouraged if you are in close contact with others you don't know.
- Sport and recreation activities are allowed, subject to conditions on gatherings, record keeping, and – where practical – physical distancing.
- Public venues such as museums, libraries and pools can open if they comply with public health measures and ensure 1-meter physical distancing and record keeping.
- Event facilities, including cinemas, stadiums, concert venues and casinos can have more than 100 people at a time, provided that there are no more than 100 in a defined space, and the groups do not mix.
- It is safe to send your children to schools, early learning services and tertiary education. There will be appropriate measures in place.
- People at higher-risk of severe illness from COVID-19 (e.g. those with underlying medical conditions, especially if not well-controlled, and seniors) are encouraged to take additional precautions when leaving home. They may work, if they agree with their employer that they can do so safely.
